# From the Director

It's hard to believe that summer is here and the school year is over. Where does the time go? My husband Allen and I have been blessed to have welcomed the Spring and Summer seasons with a trip to Rome. We found the trip mentally, emotionally and spiritually renewing. It was a pilgrimage of sorts.



Although we had many experiences, the one which touched my heart and my spirit the most was being present at a service at St. Peter's Basilica called "To Dry the Tears" presided over by Pope Francis. Anyone who has experienced the loss of a child knows that the tears never run dry. A song, a scent, a word or phrase, a thought, a gesture, can at times, all be reminders of our child. So, I carried in my heart all of those who have experienced the loss of a child through cancer, a car accident, suicide, accidental overdose, choking, sudden infant death syndrome, the result of war or violence, being trapped in a house fire and so many other tragic ways.

Although we had tickets to the service, Allen and I waited in line for 4 hours. Even that was a blessing, as it was a time of prayer and reflection. Specific names and families came to mind as I waited in line. I carried in my heart those not personally known to me, but who are my brothers and sisters in Christ. Even those who do not know Christ came to mind, as they are still my brothers and sisters in sorrow. We are all connected as we all share a deep understanding of an unwelcomed heartache known as grief.

The experience of the service was overwhelming. Being inside the Basilica, seeing the beauty of artistic geniuses, tradition, history, hearing the voices of the angelic choir, watching the Swiss Guard prepare for the coming of the Holy Father, seeing the faces of individuals and families from every part of the world! You could feel the excitement in the air. Then, the solemn service began with the procession of Pope Francis down the aisle. I had seen him on TV waving, smiling, blessing babies, and patting the checks of the infirmed. Something was different. His eyes were cast down, his face was solemn. I sensed the presence of sorrow within him. It was as if he could

feel the pain of all who were present and those who were not present. It made me think of Jesus, in the Garden of Gethsemane. He took on all our sorrow, our pain, our mistakes, our grief, our regrets and our sins. Looking at Pope Francis, I felt I was in the presence of a Saint, someone who really knew, understood, and has experienced the pain of many children and families all over the world.

His words were comforting and brought hope to us living in a world so full of suffering and heartache. I have reprinted it in my newsletter today. My hope is that all who read these words understand that God does not bring pain and suffering, no matter what our devastating circumstance or circumstances may be. But we are not alone. God is full of mercy, compassion, grace, and love. And when we weep, He weeps, too.

#### "To Dry the Tears" by Pope Francis

At times of sadness, suffering and sickness, amid the anguish of persecution and grief, everyone looks for a word of consolation. We sense a powerful need for someone to be close and feel compassion for us. We experience what it means to be disorientated, confused, more heartsick than we ever thought possible. We look around us with uncertainty, trying to see if we can find someone who really understands our pain. Our mind is full of questions but answers do not come. Reason by itself is not capable of making sense of our deepest feelings, appreciating the grief we experience and providing the answers we are looking for. How much sadness we see in so many faces all around us! How many tears are shed every second in our world; each is different but together they form, as it were, an ocean of desolation that cries out for mercy, compassion and consolation. The bitterest tears are those caused by human evil: the tears of those who have seen a loved one violently torn from them; the tears of grandparents, mothers and fathers, children; eyes that keep staring at the sunset and find it hard to see the dawn of a new day. We need the mercy, the consolation that comes from the Lord. All of us need it. This is our poverty but also our grandeur: to plead for the consolation of God, who in his tenderness comes to wipe the tears from our eyes. In our pain, we are not alone. Jesus, too, knows what it means to weep for the loss of a loved one. In one of the most moving pages of the Gospel, Jesus sees Mary weeping for the death of her brother Lazarus. Nor can he hold back tears. He was deeply moved and began to weep (John 11:33-35). The evangelist John, in describing this, wanted to show how much Jesus shared in the sadness and grief of his friends. Jesus' tears cannot go without a response on the part of those who believe in him. As he consoles, so we too are called to console. The tenderness of his gaze comforts us; the power of his word supports us and gives us hope.

#### Did you know?

- One in every four to five youth (20-25%) in the general population meet criteria for a lifetime mental disorder that is associated with severe impairment and/or distress.
- 1 in 4 parents find it difficult to obtain specialized mental health services for their child and waiting lists to see a mental health professional can be 3 months to a year.
- According to the CDC, National Center for Health Statistics, Suicide is the #2 leading cause of death in the 10 year old – 24 year old age group in the United States.

#### HOUSE OF MERCY & ENCOURAGEMENT HOME Foundation – a 501(c)3 non-profit organization What is HOME and how can help it help me and my child?

The House Of Mercy & Encouragement (HOME Foundation) was founded in February 2007 and is dedicated to promoting the social, emotional and mental health well-being of children and families. Services include but are not limited to individual and group counseling, social skills groups, play therapy, behavior modification, family counseling, and positive parenting workshops.

HOME has a fully equipped play therapy room, a sand tray room, an adult therapy room and an activity room for the convenience of children and families. Snacks, water and juice are offered as an extension of hospitality and to promote a welcoming atmosphere. Some of our most popular programs are:

- <u>Social Skills, Impulse Control and Understanding Emotions</u> a play and behaviorally based social skills group for children in PreK, K, and Grade 1 who need help with focusing and following directions and expressing emotions appropriately.
   Friendships are easily made!
- <u>Character Development, Impulse Control, Understanding Anger and More –</u> respect, responsibility, cooperation and team building are emphasized in this play and behaviorally based social skills group for children in 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 4<sup>th</sup> grade. Kids love this class!
- <u>Art Sensation</u> the combination of a licensed therapist and professional art instructor provides a unique approach to help middle school kids enjoy learning art techniques that promote creative and emotional expression. Clay, paint, and other mediums will be used to encourage positive self-esteem.
- <u>LEGO® MINDSTORMS®</u> this middle school aged social skills group focuses on problem-solving, communication, and cooperation though an introduction to robotics using LEGO® MINDSTORMS®.
- Parenting Support Workshops and Professional Workshops relax and de-stress while learning more about some of the following topics: "Junk Behavior," "SOS for Parents," "Depression, ADHD, and Anxiety: At your location or at HOME. Refreshments served in a comfortable environment.
- <u>Homework Helpers Program</u> Is homework a battle ground for you and your child? Let us help your child do their homework without tears or arguing. Trained tutors will assist your child to complete their homework. Call for more information regarding days, times and cost.
- <u>Individual Therapy/Play Therapy</u> Does your child need individual counseling or therapy? Anxiety, depression, anger, mood swings, adjusting to a divorce or death, and many other situations can be helped with counseling. Call to find that help you or your child needs.
- Family/ Couples Therapy Marriage & family therapy, communication skills and more to help your family live in peace.



HOME is located at 2030 Main Street in Dunedin (just across from the Neighborhood Wal-Mart). Many insurances are accepted and a sliding fee scale is offered.
